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reading, math, all those fit in? Is that, and then...

SENATOR BOHLKE: Okay. That first year, this next year they will be doing reading. And then as you said...

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Okay.

SENATOR BOHLKE: ...each year they will be doing one of the other subject areas.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: So they'll do it, say, five or six years and then maybe start over on writing?

SENATOR BOHLKE: Right. And we will do the writing one getting the baseline the first year and then we will do one grade the following year, another grade the following year after that...

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: In a different...okay.

SENATOR BOHLKE: ...one grade, and then come back and get a new baseline on the writing.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Okay. Now is there a national test involved in this, too, as well as the localized or customized test which I guess would be accurate?

SENATOR BOHLKE: The national test is the one that we know that I'm saying to you would be like the current Iowa Basic,...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Okay.

SENATOR BOHLKE: ...those tests that we're most familiar with.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: All right. I think I'm beginning to understand. Thank you.

SENATOR BOHLKE: Good.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Wehrbein. Senator Beutler, on the Bohlke amendment to the committee amendments.
