SENATOR BOHLKE: Because the assessment would be on those standards so...

SENATOR RAIKES: So in effect the...if it's a locally-based or school-based assessment or I think as you said a criterion-based, and the criteria in a criterion-based would be the standards?

SENATOR BOHLKE: Yes.

SENATOR RAIKES: Okay. So that in effect the school system would need to use those standards to do that test even though they didn't necessarily adopt the standards.

SENATOR BOHLKE: The writing will be...it would say, as I explained, you would have the one through four rating everyone would see of their building. The district then would take...
