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SENATOR BOHLKE: Right.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: That's all.

SENATOR BOHLKE: Well, and I know the focus on those out years and what's happening. I would agree with you other than cost of living whatever may be in there I cannot see that there would be a huge expansion in cost; and, in fact, I agree with you that certainly on the multiple test approach that those costs could come down.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Okay, thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Wehrbein. Senator Beutler, on the Bohlke amendment.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Senator Cudaback, members of the Legislature, Senator Bohlke, I'm probably from here on out going to engage you in a long series of questions; but since this is your last year, you deserve it. (Laughter)

SENATOR BOHLKE: Senator Beutler, that may have been another reason that I decided not to run again.

SENATOR BEUTLER: (Laugh) But I really do want to understand and I hope everybody wants to understand what's going on here because this is a watershed kind of event. And it's a situation where the Department of Education we told them to do one thing and they said, by golly, we're not going to do that. And they went on their way and developed the political reinforcement and the coalition building for doing something completely different from what the Legislature told them to do a while back. Isn't that accurate to begin with?

SENATOR BOHLKE: Well, Senator Beutler, we left sitting there last year the one test. What we told them to do was to go ahead with the report card and that they did do.

SENATOR BEUTLER: But two years ago we told them to proceed with the one test and that's been in our law ever since, right?

SENATOR BOHLKE: That's correct, and they...
