SENATOR SCHIMEK: (Laugh) That's right. Just bear with me. I really have been trying to follow closely here and you have cleared up some things for me, but these are the actual assessment tools that or reports that will be given for each school district to complete other than the writing assessments. SENATOR SCHIMEK: If I...let's say I'm in the fourth grade, I'm in the eighth grade, and I'm in the twelfth grade, I'm going to get tested by the local school district in the local criterion.

SENATOR BOHLKE: On one subject.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: On one subject. Okay, that's one year. Then the next year does the fourth grade, the eighth grade, and the twelfth grade get tested on another criterion?

SENATOR BOHLKE: Correct.
