But next year, ladies and gentlemen, think about supporting legislation that will develop a committee, like LB 309, for information and technology, made up of some of you who really understand how the system works. We cannot go on any further; with the millions of dollars we're spending on information and technology, not to have some kind of more responsible role, legislative role than we now have.
