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that there was anything that I could either recommend to the committee or to you because the issue came up after bill introductions. We had not had time to fully discuss and explore the issue, but it will be explored because it is a real...it is a very difficult problem in those cases and I hope we are able to find a solution and bring that to you as a proposal next year.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Wickersham. Senator Janssen, on the Wickersham amendment.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Thank you, Mr. President, members of the body. Senator Wickersham, if I could ask you a couple of questions, if you would respond please.

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: Yes.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Would you respond, Senator Wickersham?

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: Yes.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Listening to Senator Wehrbein talking about some of the problems that his constituents were having, I had a constituent talk to me last weekend about they had got their new evaluation preliminary reports and he was concerned that his property, the valuation on some of his property, had went up and he had went and requested, when the person from the assessors office came out to inspect his property or revalue it, he had made several remarks about some of the buildings and so on and so forth that had deteriorated and were falsely identified on their form, and he was feeling pretty good about that and he got his new evaluation back, so he...he...it was...it had been revalued quite a bit higher, and he went in and requested to see that form that was filled out and...and I believe he was denied access to that. Is that true? Can that person see the report that's been sent in?

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: Yes.

SENATOR JANSSEN: And he can request that?

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: Yes.
