SENATOR JANSSEN: He can request a copy of that report.

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: Yes.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Okay. Thank you, Senator Wickersham.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Janssen. Senator Wickersham, there are no further lights on. Did you wish to close? Senator Wickersham waives closing. The question before the body is, shall the Wickersham amendment, AM2984, be adopted to LB 968? All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted who care to? Record, please, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the adoption of Senator Wickersham's amendment.

SENATOR CUDABACK: The Wickersham amendment is adopted to LB 968. Mr. Clerk, next item.
