SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Baker. We are discussing the Crosby-Bromm amendment to LB 968. Senator Redfield, followed by Senator Hartnett. Senator Redfield.

SENATOR REDFIELD: Senator Cudaback, I would call the question.

SENATOR CUDABACK: The question has been called. Do I see five hands? I do see five hands. All in favor of ceasing debate on the Crosby-Bromm amendment, AM2910, to LB 968 vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted who care to? Record, please, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays to cease debate, Mr. President.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Debate does cease on the Crosby-Bromm amendment. Senator Crosby, did you wish to close on your amendment?

SENATOR CROSBY: Thank you, Senator Cudaback and members. I will just very quickly say that I listened to everything that you said, Senator Landis, and I understand why you brought the bill. And I can see the point of someone trying to make the payment and it not being accepted and so on.
