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sunset. Senator Jensen then sought to extend that sunset. Both lost. There is no revisiting. This gets set up and it will take more than an act of the Legislature, I would submit, to get this thing back where it is now, if it doesn't work out. So, again, I would point out to you that there is no bill of particulars against Health and Human Services. There have been no complaints, to speak of, against Health and Human Services, and there is nothing that the service, Rehabilitation Service for Visually Impaired can't do. And if there is something new that has...that they have not done, it can be brought to their attention. That's one of the things we're supposed to have, is a responsive state government. Now, is present management the best there is? It's better than we've had. They seem to be making progress in a number of other areas. I don't know about this, but so much obfuscation has come about by this, who knows? We know what we have now. We go into the future unknowing. We don't know what this commission is going to do. There's 45 people employed now by RSVI. What would be in the future, I don't know. But if they come back to this body and ask for more money, what do we say? I think we should stick with what is evidently not broken. The old saying, if it's not broken, don't fix it, I think that's good advice today. And I urge that you defeat LB 352. Thank you.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Thank you, Senator Tyson. Senator Bourne, on the advancement of LB 352.

SENATOR BOURNE: Thank you, Mr. President, members. I rise in support of LB 352. And I wish that I had said exactly what Senator Lynch did; he did an outstanding job. I find it interesting that we have no problem spending two or three millions dollars to give television stations tax breaks to become digital; we have no problem giving sales tax exemptions for airports, about \$600,000; last year we increased tuition reimbursement for the Nebraska Guard, half a million dollars; and we have no problem spending money on this, but when the very folks that use the service, that's currently at Health and Human Services, say it's not working, we're not listening to them. Senator Crosby and her assistant have contacted the federal government and the people who administer this very program. The federal government has said these funds will not be cut; they said, as long as you can provide...it will have a matching
