SENATOR BOHLKE: They've done the work.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: And you said...and what was the last?

SENATOR BOHLKE: No, and most school districts have done the work.

SENATOR CUDABACK PRESIDING

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Done the work, okay. Well, I don't have any more to say. I mean that does...that's a very interesting figure for me. That does help. Actually, it looks like it helps me support Senator Beutler's amendment if we're worried about mandates. I mean we've got...we've put a lot of money into this issue. It isn't that we're mandating something we're not paying for. That's in the budget at this point which you all know, \$1.4 million, to do these kinds of things, so I don't see that we're mandating something we're not paying for. We have our money where our mouth is at this point and, unless I hear something completely different between now and when we vote on this, I'm going to support Senator Beutler's amendment.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Wehrbein. Senator Chambers, on the Chambers amendment to AM3090.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: I think I'm going to give a "Cudabackism" right here, Mr. President. Based on what Senator Wehrbein said, maybe I shouldn't say anything else. But, anyway, there are a couple of things that I do want to touch on here and that relates to a situation in New York where the school system was under a lot of attack, justifiably, and they found widespread cheating by teachers and principals as far as test scores, outright cheating to make their schools look better, to make their buildings look better, to make teachers and classrooms look better. And the children are losing throughout. Children are not learning anything. I do not want a system for the black children in Omaha where test scores can be manipulated, where there can be a blending in with what's happening in west Omaha where they spend a lot of effort to make it look like our
