SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Raikes. Senator Bohlke, on the Beutler amendment. Senator Bohlke, this will be your last time.

SENATOR BOHLKE: Thank you, Mr. President. Senator Beutler, I have a question for you, please.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Beutler, will you yield to a question?

SENATOR BOHLKE: I would want to make sure that we were on the same wavelength that when we talked before and you showed me these amendments and told me your intent.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Right.

SENATOR BOHLKE: The intent with this amendment was to make sure that the standards were clear and...more clear and specific, and that the state board would go back and bring that clarity to the standards. Is that correct?

SENATOR BEUTLER: That's correct.

SENATOR BOHLKE: And then you said you had a third amendment that would be more of a discussion and then a fourth one that would come to the issue of one test.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Right.

SENATOR BOHLKE: But it is not your intention, if we need to do something to clear this up with the wording, but it's not your intention that this amendment demands, and I didn't read it that way, one statewide...it says enable...

SENATOR BEUTLER: A single test, no.
