SENATOR BOHLKE: All right. I wanted to make that clear. And if there's something we need to do with an amendment to...

SENATOR BEUTLER: And I'm agreeable to that, too, Senator, if there's something that...

SENATOR BOHLKE: ...ensure that, I'm certainly agreeable.

SENATOR BEUTLER: ...clarifies it for the state board.

SENATOR BOHLKE: But I wanted to have that discussion on the record and what the goals were. The one was to mandate the standards; the second one was to make those standards clear; the third is a discussion; and the fourth amendment we'll be getting to is the one test.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Right.

SENATOR BOHLKE: Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Bohlke. Senator Beutler, there are no further lights. Did you wish to close?

SENATOR BEUTLER: Mr. President, I hope that the explanation was clear before. This is not the most earth-shattering amendment. The big amendment will be coming two down the line here. So all this does in my opinion is to ask the state board to go back and make...and have state standards and make them clear and make them usable for all of the various purposes that state standards can be used for if and when you make other policy decisions to use them. That's all this amendment does. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Beutler. You've heard the closing on AM3091. The question is, shall AM3091 be adopted to LB 812? All those in favor of the question vote aye; opposed to the question vote nay. Have you all voted who care to? Record please, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 1 nay, Mr. President, on the adoption of Senator Beutler's amendment.

SENATOR CUDABACK: AM3091 is adopted to LB 812. Mr. Clerk,
