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and it has been a real mess. I have reports from other states where there are problems with the one test. And I know Senator Beutler doesn't want us to get in that kind of a situation; none of us want us to get in that kind of a situation. What the commissioner wants to do is more complicated. But just to make it easier I'm not sure is the reason that we want to go to a single test. I told you I did ask a survey be done of school superintendents and there are some school superintendents who e-mailed me back, not a significant number but just said, well, it's just a lot easier; just let us do the one test. There were some who said that. Well, that's not what we're about either is to just implement something because it's easier and we can go purchase it. It's what in the end we're looking for in results and I, as I said, I think Senator Beutler believes that also. The commissioner had said the reason that they wanted to do the multiple testing and let school districts measure how the standards are doing is that those schools that...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR BOHLKE: ...have adopted standards to exceed the state board standards would not be testing to those higher standards. When you do one test statewide, you're going to look at the state standards and the test will be developed along those state standards. Those schools that choose, and there are a large number of them, to adopt standards above and more rigorous would then either have to do another test to see if their standards are making any difference or if the statewide test would really be of little use to them in the classroom as far as being able to ensure that the standards are improving the quality of the teaching in the classroom. We'll talk about some other problems with tests, but that's probably one of the more significant ones that I would see. And I would assume that a majority of our school districts would adopt standards above or that may be more rigorous than the state board standards. I will be available to answer any questions and turn my light on again to continue this discussion. But I think it's important to realize those, the cheating,...

SENATOR CUDABACK: Time.

SENATOR BOHLKE: ...the testing company problems, and then the
