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responsibility. Most of us that have our investment in land, you do it because you farm it. But as far as an overall investment portfolio, I don't think too many people have 60 percent of their investment in lands today and be called fiduciary responsible.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Thank you, Senator Wehrbein. Further debate on the Wickersham amendment, Senator Bromm. Do I see five hands? I see five hands. Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: I filed a motion on the Wickersham amendment.

CLERK: Senator, Senator Wickersham's is an amendment to the committee amendments.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Oh, okay. Carry on.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Question is, shall debate cease? Those in favor vote aye, those opposed nay. Mr. Clerk, please record.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 1 nay to cease debate, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Debate has ended. Senator Wickersham, you're recognized to close.

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: Mr. President, members of the body, I hope you'll indulge me if I explain a little bit again what this amendment does, because I think most of the discussion has been about other things. There are two points at which, during the term of a lease, at which property might be sold by the Board of Educational Lands and Funds. One is during the continuation of the lease. The other is at the end of the lease. The committee amendments are fairly specific about establishing a procedure for the valuation of property or determining a minimum bid at the...during the term of a lease if there's a request for sale of the property by the tenant. The committee amendments did not interact or interface or mesh or jive or fit very well with the provisions that dealt with a sale of...potential sale of property during the term of a lease. The amendment is designed to correct that deficiency in the committee amendments. It does that by striking some language out of Section 1 and then making clear that it is at the discretion of the board that there can
