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SENATOR DIERKS: Okay. Thank you, Senator Baker. I understand there has been some difficulties with getting the land sold. I have some of that land in my own district. As a matter of fact, there's a couple sections right close to my place, but I understand that those have not been offered for sale. They've just been offered the lease back, and I think that...I'm not sure if anybody knows when that land is coming for sale, if they've set that schedule up. Maybe some of that land will never be sold. We really don't know that, do we? Senator Baker. Do we know when this land will be sold?

SENATOR BAKER: No.

SENATOR DIERKS: I mean...

SENATOR BAKER: It's...if it's going to be put up by the board's initiative, why, they'll have to, of course, advertise it and so on.

SENATOR DIERKS: But is this scheduled ahead...enough ahead of time that we know what portions are going to...

SENATOR BAKER: That...that is a big reason for the bill. There is no plan for selling this land to get down to the 25 percent. They're...

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: One minute.

SENATOR BAKER: I sat in on that committee hearing, as of course as well as the committee members. I never had any inkling of a plan.

SENATOR DIERKS: Okay. Thank you very much, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Thank you, Senator Dierks. Senator Baker, do you wish to be recognized on the Chambers amendment? Senator Baker, on the Chambers amendment.

SENATOR BAKER: I support the amendment. I think it's something I can live with. Actually, it starts with...the original Section 1 on the committee amendment says for purposes of sale
