we have until 2007 so what's the sweat; why are we watching this; why are we requiring annual reports which the original...or which this bill does require? And originally we had some reporting requirements also. The other day when we were on the progress of the university on minority hiring I asked Senator Chambers off the floor, I said...or I think it was off the floor. I said, what is...tell me why you're so concerned because the university is actually one ahead of where they were supposed to be in two years; when...when they got two more hired the first year than the target and one less the second year why...why are you concerned? He said, take my word for it...well, I don't know if those are the exact words, but he said they are not going to reach their goal with the way they're operating. Well, I think, Senator Chambers, that is exactly the feeling here. They are not going to reach the goals established by the Legislature in the way they're operating. They are selling the most...

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: One minute.

SENATOR BROMM: ...they are selling a few pieces of the most undesirable land. They are not selling a very broad scope or variety of land. And if the hearing...if the answers at the hearing were as I understood them to be, they made no bones about the fact that they may not make that much of an effort to comply. I don't think we should accept that, not when the constitution and the Supreme Court of Nebraska has clearly given the Legislature some authority to direct the sale of land and how the conditions...what...what conditions are prescribed for that sale. I don't...I don't think we're going beyond what we should be interested in here and so I'll submit the rest of my time back to the Chair. Thank you.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Thank you, Senator Bromm. Senator Cudaback, on the Chambers amendment.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Mr. President, members, I agree with the Chambers amendment so I guess I'm like everybody else, I won't be talking about it. But more times than not things boil down to money, issues come down to the dollars, and I think in this case here perhaps it's not boiling that way. I think people have a sincere interest. I remember talking about this issue
