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all. So what is the purpose of the bill? There is no purpose other than to smack the board members and show them that the Legislature is boss. Senator Wickersham, there was this lady who had another lady working for her, and the lady of the house was very upset because the lady working for her seemed to be too sassy. So, finally, the lady of the house couldn't take it anymore. She said, Sally, when I do like this, that means you come here. And Sally said, when I do like this, that means I'm not coming anywhere. So that's what the board can say. Legislature is saying, board, come here and do this. And the board says, I'm not going to do it and you can't make me and, furthermore, what you put in the bill says that I don't have to do it. So that's like the mother saying one thing to the child, the father saying something else. But in this case you don't have a dichotomy based on two different people. You have one person giving the directive--sell that land, but, on the other hand, you don't have to if you don't want to. Let me ask Senator Wickersham a question, because he may have read the bill differently from the way I have or the way I'm representing it.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Senator Wickersham.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Wickersham, what in this bill, as it's written, mandates that the board sell even one single acre? Under the language of the bill, where is that found?

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: You mean with the committee amendments?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Yes.

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: If the committee amendments are adopted, and I don't think the bill in main did either, nothing.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Nothing that mandates that.

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: That's correct.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: So what will the purpose of the bill be?

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: It is to clarify a procedure or to establish a procedure for determining a minimum bid...
