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don't even think...it was later on, it was not when it was introduced, later on, because I thought I was a pro...and I am a pro-life senator, I thought I was a good Catholic girl, following the dictates of my church. After I heard the bill in committee, which I will note that the active pro-life people or pro-life activists, I should say, out in the Rotunda, left during the...when the opponents came up. They did not stay, the two out...serpents out there did, but you see, the rest of them did not. They walked out when the university and the researchers and the scientists came to give their side of the bill; they walked out, they did not listen to the opposition, they did not know it. After I heard the bill in committee I took my name off the bill. After my name was off the bill, we went into Exec Session. We had many Exec Sessions, but we only had one dealing with this issue. I only voted on this bill once, in Exec Session I voted no; I voted no to pull it out of committee, which I feel we should not have pulled it out of committee. If Senator Brashear had anything to do with how unconstitutional this was, why didn't we do something about it then? I do not support that bracket motion, let's go for the bill, let's stay here for the full eight hours, let's everybody cut to the chase, vote for this bill. We can...during Select File we can correct everything else then. I say let's go for this bill. Another thing, and you're not going to like what I'm going to say, this is very...it's getting very bad now because I'm like Senator Bourne, I don't like it when my church targets me and hurts my 94-year-old Mother. Some of the times...some of the issues that I got, the letters and the hate letters from people did not come from my district. I will have to say though I was at home once, out socially, and a man came up to me and he said, well, Jennie, are you scalped yet? And I said, laughed and said, no, not unless you're going to do it. And he kind of laughed too, we talked about the issue, and then he said, well you see, we've got to stop these abortions. I said that's not the issue, this is not about abortion. He said, I know that,...

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: One minute.

SENATOR ROBAK: ...he understood that, but he said, we have to stop abortions because, if we don't, then the Mexicans will come into our state and take over. Yes, yes, he said that. And then I got a letter from somebody, fortunately it was not from my
