order to try to do something for the unborn, and yet it won't do anything for the unborn. Look, when the pro-life groups want to make a point they say, even the pro-choice Guttmacher Institute statistics say that. The Guttmacher Institute is a...is an institute that tells us a lot about abortion and women's health. Here's a list of 13 reasons that women give why they get abortions, in their descending order of what women declare: (1) the woman is unready for how a baby would change her life; (2) that a woman cannot afford a baby; (3) that women have problems with relationships or want to avoid single parenthood; (4) woman is not ready to...for the responsibility; (5) the woman is not...does not want others to know she has had sex or is pregnant; (6) a woman is not mature enough or is too young to have a child; (7) woman has all the children she wants or has grown-up children; (8) the woman's husband or partner wants her to have an abortion; (9) the fetus has possible health problems; (10) the woman has a health problem; (11) women's parents...the woman's parents want her to have an abortion; (12) the woman is a victim of rape or incest; (13) other reasons. What is not on the first 12 reasons given or any reason cited? I want to help research; I'm going to have an abortion so that I can assist research. It is not part of the thinking of women who choose to have abortions; it's not anywhere on this list. You might want to stand by the unborn, but you don't do it by voting for this bill. There are plenty of regular pro-life, pro-choice issues that we can fight about on a regular basis, and they do have a significant impact and they are at the heart of that issue, this is not one of them.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: One minute.

SENATOR LANDIS: There is no "protection for the unborn" in this bill, it's an irrelevance. What is relevant is Alzheimer's, Parkinson's, MS, HIV, rubella, sudden infant syndrome death (SIDS). All of those have had significant impacts in research and a move either towards vaccinations or towards cures by this kind of research which we are shutting the door on. And I ask you to read your New Testament and examine the life of Jesus Christ, who walked into the den of lepers and healed them; healing was one of His major accomplishments, it's what drew people to Him, and He was the living embodiment of the ability to heal.
