SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Time.

SENATOR BRASHEAR: I believe the people are fair. They will make the right decision given the right opportunity. Thank you.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Senator Bromm.

SENATOR BROMM: Thank you, Mr. Speaker. One of the last pieces of advice I had before leaving Wahoo this morning from my closest friend was that, you know, you really don't have to talk on everything. And I think...I think they were giving me a hint, but I guess I'm not necessarily...I didn't come here to be passive and rubber-stamp anything and I'm not about to start now. I have expressed concerns, and Senator Hilgert may have mentioned in his opening that he had noticed I had concerns about the constitutionality of the bill. I want to touch on those briefly, and Senator Matzke outlined some of the concerns very well, and I won't...I won't repeat that, but going beyond that and examining the words in the bill, which I tried to do quickly when Senator Hilgert presented the bill to me and asked me to cosponsor the bill, which I did not, were that constitutionally, without any rationale in the bill for exercising our police powers, can we distinguish between outlawing the use of fetal tissue from induced abortion versus use of tissue from a spontaneous abortion? What is the rationale? Where is the preface? Where is the compelling state interest in saying it's okay to use one type of tissue, it's not okay to use another type of tissue? Where is the basis for that? I'm not suggesting there isn't one. I'm suggesting there is none outlined to me, and I've not really heard one today in the discussion thus far. The bill goes on to say that use of aborted fetal tissue means the sale or purchase of aborted fetal tissue for research or treatment. Does this mean that if I'm a pharmacist and I dispense a medicine that is derived from aborted fetal tissue that is from an induced abortion that I'm violating this law? Does it mean that or does it not? I don't
