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know. I think treatment and research greatly need definition and need a narrowing so that they can be interpreted if this bill is going to mean anything. Section 3, any person employed by this state, et cetera, within the scope of his employment, it's unlawful to engage or participate in, to engage or participate in the use of aborted fetal tissue. Now what does that mean? How far-reaching is that? How broad is that? How narrow is that? It begs for a definition, so that it is legally enforceable. Unless this bill is what it was presented to me as, when I was asked to sign onto the bill, and that was to make a statement, if this bill was to make a statement, those words are fine. The bill is introduced. It's on the floor. We're having discussion. It makes a statement, but I feel very sorry for those senators who are labeled one way or the other by virtue of their vote on this bill because it's not fair. It is not fair.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: One minute.

SENATOR BROMM: And all those senators, some of whom may have signed on to make a statement, are put in a position of making decisions like Senator Bourne was describing, which I think is a very valid point, which many of us forget or we need to be reminded of from time to time, about what our...what our duties are here. I'm not sorry we're having the discussion. I'm not sorry at all. I am sorry that it's being mislabeled and misinterpreted and misrepresented to the public to a large extent, and we're allowing that. We're allowing that. Senator Brashear, I don't think this should be framed as a pro-life, pro-choice issue. I'm sorry. I don't agree with that at all, and we're allowing that to happen here. This is an issue about research, about whether or not the guidelines that should be followed, the standards that we would expect to be followed are being followed by the University of Nebraska, a state institution. This could be accomplished very, very well and more...

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: Time.

SENATOR BROMM: ...effectively through an interim study, which I think is where this thing should have gone to begin with. Thank you.
