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that. That was fine, but I think it's a little strange that they target other people. And death doesn't occur at birth, death doesn't occur at birth. These people...some people are still living, when they are born and grow on to a greater age and develop mental disorders, but that is one thing, one issue that they will not look at, supporting people that can't speak for themselves and don't have the resources to speak for themselves, and I have a little problem with that. And so now I'm a little confused on how the...how the Catholic church really does operate. And Senator Dwite Pedersen said hatred, anger, and resentment is a disease of its own. Well, I think that's true, it is a disease of its own. And I think let's go for this vote. I oppose the bracket motion. I'll vote no on LB 1405 but let's go for the bracket...let's go for...let's oppose the bracket motion, let's go for the vote. Let's see if there is any unconstitutionality in this bill. It can be sorted out on Select File. We have all the time in the world. We don't have to adjourn by April 12th. We have the whole year to do this. There is nothing in the constitution says that we can't work past April 12th. I think we need to discuss this. If this is the way it is, I...maybe my...

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: One minute.

SENATOR ROBAK: ...confusion will be solved after this is debated. I guess that's all I have to say. I just think that we need to...we need to get to the bottom of this. We need to vote our consciences, and the anger, resentment and hatred will not be in the body. It'll be out there with the pro-life activists, and I say the activists because all people, all Catholics, all pro-life people are not the activists that are so hateful and mean and spiteful behind that glass door. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: (Visitors introduced.) Senator Jensen.
