incentives and so forth that some states offer for that. And I would be interested in at least looking at that. If we're going to offer tax incentives or tax help for broadcasters, I would hope we could consider that kind of thing for small gas stations, some of which are the only ones, they're the only ball game in town in some places, but they are very...they're very valuable, very loyal, very hard working businesses and if I thought this would put the one across the street from me out of business, I would, in no way, shape or form, vote for it. But I know that this will help, give us a chance to respond to that concern, and so I am encouraging you to...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR BROMM: ...adopt the Connealy amendment. I think it's a good approach. I didn't get a chance to talk about the value of the by-product, which I'm very familiar with, with ethanol, but the various by-products, not the by-product. I'm more familiar with the livestock feed by-product but there are others as well that contribute a lot to the economic activity surrounding these plants. So I encourage the body to adopt the Connealy amendment. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Bromm. Senator Schrock, I should have told you that you talked three times on the Connealy amendment already. So, Senator Beutler, followed by Senators Chambers, Schmitt, Kremer. Senator Beutler.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Senator Cudaback, members of the Legislature, I'm certainly going to be supporting the Connealy amendment and supporting the bill if the amendment is attached. I guess I'm one city boy who is convinced that there's a lot of good that can come from this state paying attention to the development of ethanol and encouraging the development of ethanol.
