SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Kremer. Senator Wehrbein, on the Connealy amendment.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Question.

SENATOR CUDABACK: The question has been called. Do I see five hands. I do see five hands. The question before the body is, shall debate close on the Connealy amendment to the committee amendments to LB 1234? All in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted who care to? Record please, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 1 nay, on the motion to cease debate, Mr. President.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Debate does cease. Senator Connealy, did you wish to close on your amendment?

SENATOR CONNEALY: Thank you, Senator Cudaback. Once again, this changes the bill from a mandate to a requirement that we offer ethanol-blended fuels at the lowest octane, at a location. And I will, when we get to the point of the Bromm amendment, I probably will support that also. This is a step back from the bill. It's less of a requirement for stations and I just ask that you support the amendment.

SENATOR CUDABACK: The question before the body is, shall the Connealy amendment be adopted to the committee amendments to LB 1234. All in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted who care to? Record please, Mr. Clerk. A record vote has been requested, Mr. Clerk.
