SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I need to find out what is left of the committee amendment, in view of the fact that Senator Connealy's amendment was adopted. And I will tell you why I have a difficulty. Senator Connealy's amendment says, "Strike amendment 1 and all amendments thereto and insert the following amendment". Is "amendment 1" the committee amendment? Is that what was stricken by his amendment? May we approach?

SENATOR CUDABACK: Are you asking the Chair, Senator Chambers?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: I'm asking anybody (laughter) who knows, so may we approach and ask the assistance of the Chair and the Clerk?

SENATOR CUDABACK: Yes, you may.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: May I continue, Mr. President?

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Chambers, we will give you the full five minutes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you. Senator Schmitt, in view of the fact that the Connealy amendment struck all of the committee amendment, the airplane on which your amendment would have ridden as a passenger has gone down in flames (laughter), so there is nothing to which your amendment can be attached, because it was drafted to the committee amendments, but they are gone. So the only thing we have now is Senator Connealy's atrocious amendment carrying Senator Preister's somewhat mitigating amendment, but that's all that's left now, nothing about the aircraft. But I think were the amendments, the committee amendments still before us, I would support your amendment, but there is nothing for it to attach to. And I wanted to be sure of that before I made my comment. Thank you, Mr. President.
