10,000 feet, I still believe it can happen. And so, with that, I think we better get away from the mandate and adopt Senator Chambers' amendment. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Schmitt. We are on the Chambers amendment, FA354. Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, this is my attempt to bring us face-to-face with what it is we are doing, and we can now take a vote on it. And there will be a record vote on this specific proposition where we leave it up to the retailer to decide what products are going to be offered for sale to the public. This bill, if you add my amendment, and this is for Senator Raikes' consumption, would have the MTBE prohibition of Senator Preister, but it would take away any mandated aspect from the bill. It would say in effect that the mandated thing in this bill is that MTBE cannot be used in petroleum products after a certain date, I think it's July. Then Senator Beutler had some information added, and it had something to do with checking out ground water. This amendment of mine makes the whole rest of the bill voluntary. Remember this, it is not doing anything that is that greatly significant, because there is no penalty if a retailer decides not to sell or offer for sale ethanol. As Senator Raikes pointed out, this ethanol could be offered for sale in a container other than an underground tank. There are vagaries, there is vagueness in the bill. My amendment makes it all optional. I believe that in this country options should be granted to the citizens and not dictates given where dictates are inappropriate. I don't think it's appropriate for the state to dictate to some retailers, because it's not going to affect all of them the same way, adapt or die. That is not really an option. That is as much an option as it is for a person on the street to have a pistol put to his or her head, and wielder of the pistol says, give me your money or your life! That is not really an uncoerced option. This amendment, I think, should be adopted.
