maybe they are finally gelling around what is the critical issue, and that is whether we can really, really make people buy something they don't want to buy, or whether we can make retailers offer for sale something that people may not want to buy. Neither one of them make much sense to me and I'm going to support Senator Chambers' amendment, because, fundamentally, all we're doing in the Connealy amendment is just kind of shifting things around and saying even if people don't want to buy it, you have to try to sell it, where the old approach was, well, even if you don't want it, you have to buy it because it's going to be the only thing around. Looks to me like there isn't much difference between the two positions. As I've indicated, neither one of them make much sense to me. If ethanol is a good product, it's good for vehicles, it's good for people, it's good for the air, it's good for other things, and even if it was, heaven forbid, cheaper, if it was cheaper, wouldn't that have something to do with this issue? And I never have understood quite why it wasn't cheaper, except last year we had bills in Revenue Committee and people kept telling me that this industry, the ethanol industry wasn't economic, couldn't produce ethanol economically, so it needed support from the state. And then after it got support from the state, then it needed more support at the gas pump because you had to pay the same amount or more for it when it really should have been cheaper. Doesn't make any sense to me.
