hardship on a small station or a perceived hardship, so I will support the Bromm amendment.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Schrock. Senator Chambers, on the Bromm amendment.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, and to notify Senator Bromm of what I'm intending, I want to put a...in line 5 I want to put a period after the word "fuel" and strike the date and simply say it will not apply to those stations. And then let those who have an interest in trying to make it apply come in and show us why it ought to apply at all. If I strike that language...I can't offer it now because the...where we are now, the committee amendment, although it has become the bill, is what we're amending and I cannot amend an amendment to an amendment. But it at least gives you a chance to be thinking about it. I'm going to support your amendment, and then once it's adopted I would then offer mine to do what I've briefly discussed here. Thank you, Mr. President.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Chambers. Senator Beutler, excuse me, your light just went off. There are no further lights. Senator Bromm, did you wish to close on your amendment? Senator Bromm.

SENATOR BROMM: Yes, thank you. Once again, this exempts those stations with two tanks or less until January 1 of 2002 from the requirement that they offer the ethanol provisions in Senator Connealy's amendment. Ask for your support.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Bromm. We are voting on the Bromm amendment, FA355. All in favor of the Bromm amendment vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Please record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 28 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the adoption of Senator Bromm's amendment.

SENATOR CUDABACK: The Bromm amendment is adopted. Mr. Clerk.
