I've never had any problems with it in what so...any way, shape or form. It goes as fast as I need it to go at my age. It goes winter, summer, hot weather, race tracks where the dust is real heavy. I'm a counselor on the tracks in the summertime. I've never had any problem with ethanol and I would tell anybody try it. It's...I think it burns clean. We've had some neat things put on this bill that I'd hate like the dickens to see to go on the side if the bill doesn't get passed but, yet...yet, the bill does bother me in some areas, especially with the mandate. It's not mandating people to use it but it is mandating people...the...to carry it. There's questions about the tanks, not the tanks that they have but there...our bulk plants, are they going to be able to carry it. Senator Baker has brought some questions up. But the rural people aren't going to use this, then there is problem with marketing, as Senator Vrtiska said. I don't know where their marketing has been. Two of the questions I think were answered yesterday but that still concern me is, what's going to happen to the price of ethanol when the market goes up? We all know the market has been low on grains. The corn market goes up, well, then is ethanol going to go up? There's people on both side, as everything, but this is one of those bills that treats you as a senator in my area like a wishbone. You know, you say one day it looks like a good bill, I can support it. The next day, you know, what good is it going to do? I don't know that this bill is going to help anybody else buy ethanol. The marketing is what needs to be done there instead of forcing it. I still have questions about the tax credits that they get now. We've given a lot of tax credits to ethanol, which I have supported and believe that they should be there. But when them tax credits go away is the price then going to go up too? These are all questions I have so this...I still feel like a wishbone and have listened to it and I think every amendment that's come up is something that we need to...to listen to and hopefully help us make a decision. I don't believe in forcing in any way, shape or form. I do believe that...and I don't believe that by forcing it's going to cause people to buy more ethanol. Marketing is a wonderful tool and if it's used right should have something to do with the sale of more ethanol. We've built more plants and that's happened automatically without any bills like
