SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Beutler. Senator Raikes, on the Chambers amendment.

SENATOR RAIKES: Thank you, Mr. President and members. Senator Chambers, if I could ask you a question or two.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Chambers, would you yield to a question, please.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Yes, I will.

SENATOR RAIKES: Senator, I'm trying to understand how...how your amendment would play out. Currently, I'm a retailer. I offer 87 at \$1.50; I offer ethanol at \$1.47, and I offer premium at \$1.65, say.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Yes.

SENATOR RAIKES: With the passage of your amendment and this bill, would I still be able to do that?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Yes.

SENATOR RAIKES: Okay, so in other words right now we have an advantage for ethanol in that I can buy a higher quality product at a lower price as compared to unleaded, and that...that option would be preserved with your amendment?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Yes.

SENATOR RAIKES: Is that correct?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: That's correct.

SENATOR RAIKES: Okay. Let me ask you this, why...why would you not agree with Senator Landis' suggestion that we simply boil this down to if you have three or more tanks that you use for gasoline as a retailer that one of those has to be ethanol?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: If we came down to that simple statement, you would hear me leave the choir singing "Hallelujah". I would
