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SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you, Senator Connealy. (Laugh) Members of the Legislature, there's confusion in the camp of the ethanol purveyors. John Barleycorn is at work here this morning. This amendment goes right to the issue of price but they're afraid to acknowledge what it is they want, although that's the only thing they've talked about all morning. All yesterday that we were on this bill I paid attention. I was a part of the discussion. I paid attention today. Senator Raikes has pointed out that this bill is not going to touch price and that's all that they are interested in. Even Connealy, in a backhand way, acknowledged that he wants this ethanol blend to be sold competitively and you're talking again about price. Now this bill is not going to ensure that 85 octane comes into this state. And Reynolds Brothers cannot ensure that either. They say, well, if contingency A pans out, contingency B pans out, contingency C pans out, then we may be able to get it to you. They have not said in anything Senator Schrock has given us, because they cannot say it, that once this bill is in effect we will ensure that there is 85 octane available throughout your...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...state. They cannot say that, and if they're distributing to others, they definitely can't say it. That's why they gave themselves a way out in this latest publication; if the product is delivered to us, if it's put in our system, then we may get it to you. But not...there's no certainty. They are not crazy so they are not going to promise what they can't deliver, but Senators Connealy and Schrock want us to compel retailers to sell that which is not available. So what their real goal is is to outlaw the sale of regular. That's what the green copy aimed at. That's what the Connealy amendment succeeds in doing now, but they should see that their bill is losing steam. My bil...my amendment got 17 votes. It probably would have got more. I didn't realize they hadn't cleared the board when we took the vote. When we took the roll call vote, the other votes that had been given were still up on the board which...

SENATOR CUDABACK: Time.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...is not to happen. I hadn't noticed it,
