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much...if you do those three things, is that enough?

SENATOR SCHROCK: We're getting close. I need a commitment from the other side to discuss the issues and to look at ways to increase the consumption of ethanol, without doing a mandate. That's what I need, also.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Okay.

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: This is the tough question. Is there an identifiable other side? Well, I...I mean, normally, I'm going to sit under the balcony. I'm going to do this, and that's what I say, and the trouble is that it's done now here on the floor, and my minute is going to run out, I would hope that you could identify who those people are, and if we can try to put this into some arrangement and some agreement, now is the time to do it before we roll the dice and, because if you do get cloture, it's going to be a difficult...for the next round, you may well get it, and if you don't get cloture, you may well not get anything. And I'm not one that wants to see that happen. So I will yield back my time with one proviso, Mr. President, when my time is done, would you please recognize me as the Speaker.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Yes, I will, Senator.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: I'd yield back my time.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Your time is up. Senator Stuhr, on the Wickersham amendment. What did you say, Senator Kristensen? I could not hear you. You've got to speak into the microphone, please.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: I'm not sure you wanted to hear what I said. (Laughter) For scheduling purposes, Mr. President, at 4:00 today, there will be an...it's my mistake, I did not put it on. There will be former senator recognition at 4:00 today, a short period of time, but just so you know. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: And I apologize, Mr. Speaker. I did not understand what you said the first time. Senator Stuhr.
