we have over \$500 million leaving our state's economy. Also, for every 100 million additional bushels of corn that the ethanol industry uses, corn prices are actually increased from 4 to 8 cents. And in 2001, they would have to...this would be an incentive if they reached...

SENATOR CUDABACK: Time.

SENATOR STUHR: ...15 percent of all of their sales, then they would receive a credit of 2 cents on each of those gallons. In 2002, it...
