SENATOR CHAMBERS: Well, if we make a decision, is that going to be binding on those other people?

SENATOR CONNEALY: I don't think so.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: So then they're talking about one thing and we're talking about another. Something like I said the other day, we'll all in a foot race but we're on a different track, running in different directions, more or less.

SENATOR CROSBY: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you, Senator Connealy. I don't see that as negotiation. I see it as chaos and confusion. And if Senator...oh, I don't see him back there, but if Senator Schrock wants to get his cloture vote, I think he's entitled to go on and try to get it. If he gets it, he loses because I will make sure that I can repeat on Select File everything I said here, and I've been getting a lot of calls from the public, and the next time I think I can get a kill motion accepted because people are going to start calling you all the way they're calling me. And they will get us to kill this bill outright and there will be noting. That's what they need to look at.

SENATOR CROSBY: (Gavel) Thank you, Senator Chambers. That wasn't for you. It was because the noise in the Chamber is getting to be a little too much, even I can't hear you.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: It put such fear in me that I'm going to stop at this point. (laughter)

SENATOR CROSBY: Thank you. (laugh) Thank you. Okay. Further discussion of the Jones amendment, Senator Schrock. Senator Schrock, your light is the next light. Further discussion, Senator Schmitt.

SENATOR SCHMITT: I didn't have a whole lot to say. I was just going to turn my light on there and see if Senator Schrock was going to get back here so he could turn his own and visit with Senator Jones. But I do have a question for Senator Jones, I guess, that I've been wanting to ask, maybe all morning.
