SENATOR RAIKES: Well, thank you, Senator, for your responsiveness. And I will look over this material you've provided. Thank you.

SENATOR CROSBY: Thank you, Senator Dierks. Any further discussion on Senator Dierks' amendment? Seeing none, Senator Dierks, I recognize you to close on your amendment.

SENATOR DIERKS: Thank you, Madam President and members of the Legislature. I am happy for the ability to discuss this with Senator Quandahl and with Senator Raikes. And I would encourage any more debate on the issue, because I want everybody to be clear on what we're trying to do. I think it's...I think what I'm trying to do is provide an honorable way of taking care of prescription items. And that's the intent of the legislation. With that, I would urge your support of the amendment, and then that would become the bill. Thank you.

SENATOR CROSBY: Thank you, Senator Dierks. You've heard the closing. The question is the adoption of the Dierks amendment to LB 833. All in favor vote aye, opposed no. Record, please.

CLERK: 28 ayes, 0 nays, Madam President, on the adoption of Senator Dierks' amendment.

SENATOR CROSBY: The Dierks amendment is adopted.

CLERK: I have nothing further on the bill, Madam President.

SENATOR CROSBY: Thank you. Senator Smith.

SENATOR SMITH: Madam President, I move the advancement of LB 833 to E & R for engrossing.

SENATOR CROSBY: You've heard the motion to advance LB 833 to E & R for engrossing. All in favor say aye, opposed no. It is advanced. Mr. Clerk.
