

TRANSCRIPT PREPARED BY THE CLERK OF THE LEGISLATURE  
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LB 1003

SENATOR SCHROCK: I am not. The current statute states that be the exclusive negotiating and contracting agency to purchase insurance or risk management services and, after consultation with the state agency for which the insurance or services are purchased, enter into such contracts on behalf of the state and its agencies, officials, and employees to the extent deemed necessary and in the best interest of the state, and authorize payment for such purchase out of the appropriate funds created by the section. This simply makes it sure that the DAS, Department of Administrative Services, is responsible for any contracts. That's the best I can explain it now.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Schrock. You've heard the opening on the Pederson amendment, AM2881, to the committee amendments to LB 1003. We're open for discussion on the Pederson amendment. Seeing no lights, Senator Schrock, did you wish to close on the amendment? Senator Schrock waives closing on the Pederson amendment, AM2881. The motion before...or the question before the body is, shall the Pederson amendment, AM2881, be adopted to committee amendments to LB 1003? All in favor vote aye, opposed nay. We are voting on the Pederson amendment to the committee amendments to LB 1003. Have you all voted who care to? We are voting on the Pederson amendment to the committee amendments. Have you all voted? Senator Schrock.

SENATOR SCHROCK: Been a long day. It sure would be nice to have one more button pushed and then we could move on, but...

SENATOR CUDABACK: Are you...record, please, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President.

SENATOR CUDABACK: The Pederson amendment is adopted. Mr. Clerk, next item to the bill. We're now on the committee amendments. Senator Beutler, on the committee amendments to LB 1003.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Senator Schrock, just a few questions. I wasn't anticipating that we would move so quickly to this bill, but it wasn't clear to me with respect to institutions of higher education who are eligible to participate. Is it all colleges or all institutions? It's not limited to Nebraska institutions?
