SENATOR BEUTLER: Okay.

SENATOR SCHROCK: ...could split it up a little bit, too, if you wanted to, to compromise on that.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Well, you know, in a sense what we're doing this year in the Legislature, and I understand we do it a little differently every year and try to even it out, but in a sense what we're doing is helping the low income if they're minority and more of the middle class, but the low income who are not a minority are getting kind of left out here,...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR BEUTLER: ...at least in this year's...in this year's...they're not getting any of this year's pile.

SENATOR SCHROCK: Something else that would be attractive to me, Senator Beutler, because I would like to see this money used to try and keep people in state and really, at the present time, it doesn't do that, but you could use the endowment fund only for those students who go to in-state colleges maybe and universities.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Well, they...they put that in here, Senator.

SENATOR SCHROCK: Oh, so that's...that's not benefit...

SENATOR BEUTLER: They, with regard to the endowment fund, they did limit it to in state, it appears.

SENATOR SCHROCK: Okay. Well,...

SENATOR BEUTLER: I guess that's because it's perceived it would be state money, although if it's private money I'm not sure necessarily why that should be.

SENATOR SCHROCK: So I'm getting up to speed on that so I stand
