

TRANSCRIPT PREPARED BY THE CLERK OF THE LEGISLATURE
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March 29, 2000 LB 1003

SENATOR STUHR: Thank you, Mr. President and members of the Legislature. This is really just a technical, almost a clean-up part. But, if you'll look on page 13 of the amendment, what my amendment will say, on line 15, is to include the investment performance of the funds. I don't have the amendment in front of me, but it may not be included in the rules and regs, and I...I believe it's important that the performance of the funds be noted, and that's what this would...this amendment would do.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Stuhr. You've heard the opening on the Stuhr amendment. Senator Wehrbein, did you wish to talk to the bill or to the amendment? Senator Wehrbein waives off. Open for discussion on the Stuhr amendment. Seeing no discussion, Senator Stuhr, to close, if you wish. Senator Stuhr waives closing. The question before the body is, shall the Stuhr amendment to LB 1003 be adopted? All in favor vote aye, opposed nay. We're voting on the Stuhr amendment. Have you all voted who care to? Record, please, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the adoption of Senator Stuhr's amendment.

SENATOR CUDABACK: The Stuhr amendment is adopted.

CLERK: I have nothing further on the bill, Mr. President.

SENATOR CUDABACK: We are now open for discussion on the advancement of LB 1003 to E & R Initial. Senator Wehrbein, on the advancement.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Thank you, Mr. President, and members. I'm not sure who to ask, whether it's Senator Bohlke or Senator...what's your name, Ed, Schrock?

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Schrock.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Where...where...what's the money in this issue at this point, so I'm clear? I intend on supporting the bill, but I...I would be interested to know.
