SENATOR D. PEDERSON: You mean amount of contribution?

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Yes, or all the state...is there...

SENATOR D. PEDERSON: There...there's no state funds.

SENATOR D. PEDERSON: In the original there was...there was a state fund. The...if you were talking about from the amount that goes into the money to operate this, in the first year it's \$300,000, and then there's no further payment. And then, from then on, it's anticipated that the money that will come in from the...from the investment itself will pay the ongoing operating costs.
