SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Schrock, would you respond?

SENATOR SCHROCK: That is correct.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Okay. And just so I can look at it, what number was that bill?

SENATOR SCHROCK: LB 999.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Okay.

SENATOR SCHROCK: I have a copy here if you want to...

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: I'm going to pass for the moment.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Kristensen, did you pass your time? Senator Wickersham.

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: Well, Senator Schrock, if I were to be asking how this bill relates to gas tax and the setting of the gas tax rate, what would your response be?

SENATOR SCHROCK: I'd say it's propane gas.

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: And do we...and do we collect gas tax on gas that is delivered, propane gas that is delivered in cylinders? This...the LB 999 appears to have something to do with Chapter 70...57. The bill that is in front of us seems to have something to do with Chapter 66. That's nine chapters away. Is there some other link?

SENATOR SCHROCK: Senator Wickersham, if it's used for motor fuels, it is taxed. The propane and the natural gas...the propane is taxed then, so it has that relationship.

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: Is there anything in LB 989 that...LB 999 that talks about collecting that tax?

SENATOR SCHROCK: I don't believe there is.
