The employees who work for that company will have stress, less stress in their job because they will know that their children are being well taken care of; they're being watched over; they're being stimulated; they're being educated; they're being nourished; they're being given food that is good for them; and they're being given the best care besides what a mother can give which I think is probably the most important aspect of a child's life is their mother's care, but this is the next best thing. And I really want...I don't want just licensed childcare. I really want quality childcare and that is the reason for this amendment because of my passion for quality childcare. And it takes a while to get this. It takes money to get this. So I'd appreciate it if you would give this consideration, and I will be glad to answer any questions.
