SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Thank you, Senator. You've heard the opening on the committee amendments. Debate on the committee amendments? Seeing none, Senator, you're recognized to close. He waives closing on the committee amendments. The question before the body is the adoption of those amendments. All in favor vote aye; all opposed vote nay. Please record.

CLERK: 31 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the adoption of committee amendments.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: The committee amendments are adopted. Anything further on the bill, Mr. Clerk? We're debating the advancement of the bill. Seeing no lights, Senator Vrtiska, you're recognized to close on advancement of the bill.

SENATOR VRTISKA: Thank you, Mr. Speaker. In closing, I just need to remind the body that these are changes that were worked out, again, by the...by my staff and by the Workers' Comp Court and merely clarifies a number of what perceived problems in the administration of the workers' comp legislation, and I would hope you advance the bill to E & R Initial. With that, thank you, Mr. Speaker.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: You've heard the closing. The question before the body is the advancement of LB 1221. All those in favor vote aye; all those opposed vote nay. Please record.

CLERK: 33 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the advancement of LB 1221.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: LB 1221 advances. We next move to LB 932.

CLERK: Mr. President, LB 932, it's a bill by Senator Landis. (Read title.) The bill was introduced on January 5 of this year, referred to the Banking Committee. The bill was advanced to General File. I have committee amendments, Mr. President. (AM2027, Legislative Journal page 327.)
