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device right now so the old...they used to look like roulette wheels. They can't use them anymore. I know Senator Preister is not here today, but he had a question about that, one of his charitable organizations that were told they couldn't use this wheel now. This would allow them to use what's already in place but it's for larger organizations on a smaller scale to use these at charitable organization fund raising events. That's what the cleanup bill does, and I'll answer any questions if anyone had any. Thank you.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Mr. Clerk, next item.

ASSISTANT CLERK: Senator Janssen would move to amend with AM2379. (Legislative Journal page 1459.)

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Senator Janssen, you're recognized to open.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Thank you, Mr. Speaker and members of the body. This amendment would allow the licensed organizations that have bingo particularly at the State Fair. Right now the statute says that it appears that they can have the temporary license at seven days. This would move that to 12 days. And it is something that I'd like to have Senator Baker allude to this a little bit. This was his idea and it was brought to us by an organization that conducts bingo at the State Fair, and he will explain a little more of that to you. Thank you. Senator Baker, would you...

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: We're debating on...are you yielding your time, Senator Janssen, of your opening?

SENATOR JANSSEN: Yes, I yield the remainder of my time to Senator Baker.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Okay, there's approximately nine minutes, Senator Baker.

This was brought to my attention by the State Lion's Club and it would apply to any charitable nonprofit organization like them, but they were having to use two or three different club charters to get a bingo license that would carry
