SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: You've heard the opening of the Stuhr amendment. Senator Bohlke, followed by Senator Kiel, Quandahl, Price, and Suttle. Thank you.

SENATOR BOHLKE: Thank you, Mr. President and members. And, Senator Stuhr, I'll be asking you a question in a minute because there's been a change from the amendment I signed onto this morning to where we are. As I understand what you're saying, originally as we were bringing this to the floor, we had the money in for grants for schools who could demonstrate a need. And the task force was to analyze if those grants were making a difference in improving the quality of the education and could justify probably increasing those grants in the future to more schools.

SENATOR STUHR: Well, actually the task force now will be much more in-depth as far as studying the needs across the state.

SENATOR BOHLKE: No, but I'm asking that was the intent of the task force when we had the grants in.

SENATOR STUHR: There was actually another advisory committee. There were two committees when we had the grants. There were two committees, an advisory committee that looked at the grants and then a separate task force, a separate...

SENATOR BOHLKE: In the bill that I had my name on?

SENATOR STUHR: Um-hum, yes. Yes.

SENATOR BOHLKE: So, now we don't have the advisory committee.

SENATOR STUHR: No.

SENATOR BOHLKE: You've eliminated them.

SENATOR STUHR: Right.
