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know that I'm going to support the bill because I think it's too small. It's a Band-aid and I think we can do better here. I think that we can really create a seamless system here between business, labor, and schools and do something really wonderful for our students because these jobs are absolutely crucial. One of these days we're going to have plumbers that make far more than doctors because we aren't going to have enough of them. But those aren't the things we're actually teaching in the schools because you can't find a plumber who is available or who will work or is certified to teach in a school. But by incorporating them all together, I think we can accomplish this. So, Senator Bohlke, Senator Stuhr, I hope you will think about this...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR REDFIELD: ...before we move forward with the bill. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Redfield. Senator Hilgert, on the Stuhr amendment.

SENATOR HILGERT: Thank you, Mr. President, members. Senator Redfield, I agree. When we were studying work force investment, during an interim study we had last summer in Business and Labor, we looked at all the job training opportunities there were in the state and we tried to do a survey of them. And one of the things I would have liked to incorporate more in our work force investment was the relationship between Work Force Investment Act and our Welfare to Work programs. I know there are some linkages, but I, too, would like to see that closer and more comprehensively done. Certainly, certainly this belongs with Work Force Investment Act. I certainly agree with the intent of what's trying to be done here, and I agree with all the motivations. But I, as Senator Redfield, I agree with her that we should work towards trying to make this more of a seamless, unified attempt to train individuals in the state of Nebraska that need training and to at the same time, of course, help our work force shortages. People talk about, you know, cutting this, cutting that and efficiencies and so forth. And one of the things that I've observed is, you know, why there's some taxes lower in Iowa than Nebraska? They have a million
