SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Stuhr. The house is under call. Senator Bohlke. Senator Bohlke, the house is under call. Please report to the Chamber. Senator Stuhr says we may go ahead. The question before the body is, shall the Stuhr amendment, AM3193, be adopted to LB 495? All in favor of the question vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted who care to? Record, please, Mr. Clerk.

ASSISTANT CLERK: 39 ayes, 0 nays on the adoption of Senator Stuhr's amendment, Mr. President.

SENATOR CUDABACK: The Stuhr amendment is adopted. Raise the call, please. We are now open for discussion on the advancement of LB 495 to E & R Initial. We are open for discussion. Seeing no lights on, Senator Stuhr, did you wish to close on advancement of LB 495? Senator Stuhr. Senator waives closing. The question before the body is, shall LB 495 be advanced to E & R Initial? All in favor of the question vote aye, opposed nay. Record please, Mr. Clerk.

ASSISTANT CLERK: 32 ayes, 0 nays on the motion to advance the bill.

SENATOR CUDABACK: LB 495 does advance to E & R Initial. Mr. Clerk, next agenda item.

ASSISTANT CLERK: The next item, Mr. President, is LB 803 which was introduced by the Government, Military and Veterans Affairs Committee. (Read title.) The bill was read for the first time on January 20, referred to the Government, Military and Veterans Affairs Committee. That committee reports the bill to General File with committee amendments. (AM2970, Legislative Journal page 1373.)
