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SENATOR WICKERSHAM: The green copy.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Okay, I...that's where I'm not up to speed, and I'll study it a little longer. So, we're actually interchanging, between the green copy and the white copy, and I need to understand a little better what it does. But the handout that you have is primarily the county distribution. We don't have a handout on the cities and towns...

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: The cities aren't affected.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Okay. It's only a major chang...that's the kind of thing I wanted to find out, the county distribution is the one that's changed, primarily.

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: That's correct.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Okay, I think that's all I have right now. I'm going to try to understand a little better.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Thank you, Senator Wehrbein. Senator Beutler.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Mr. Lieutenant Governor, members of the Legislature, first of all, Senator Wickersham, I need to apologize because I guess it was my own personal misunderstanding about what your...what you were intending to do. Having said that, let me begin to engage in a conversation about these formulas and the way they work, because I need to be sure I understand how this is all flowing. And I probably even need to bother you for some basic background information about how existing formulas work, because you appear to be combining a number of formulas and then internally changing how they work, in a couple of instances anyway. With respect to municipalities there are at least...there are at least two current state aid programs that you're combining, is that accurate?

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: The bill, Senator, the bill doesn't affect the distribution of state aid to municipalities, except in a way that they view as beneficial, and that is conversion of the dollars that are distributed in excess of the equalization pool,
