previously separated the two rivers. Many years ago, the Platte County surveyor and the Butler County surveyor began research on the location of the county line. In doing their research they discovered that in fact the state statutes that we have in...in...in the law are not identical, and that the county line has been in question since at least 1938. So we have two problems here, we have a river that has moved and we have a statute in our books where the...that describes the south boundary line of Platte County, the north boundary line of Butler County, and they're described as being in two different places. With respect to Platte County, the description in the statute says that it extends south to the south bank of the Platte River. With respect to Butler County the description in the statute says it extends north to the south bank of the main channel of the Platte River, and that's not...not necessarily and is not the same place. You can imagine the problems and questions that have arisen with respect to law enforcement, residency, taxation and so on and so forth. Now I became aware of this problem I think shortly after I came to the Legislature, and I met with each of the county boards, Butler County and Platte County, and I said, if you as counties can find a solution that is acceptable to both of you as county boards, I will be glad to try to introduce the legislation and change the law to comply with whatever your agreement is. They have done that, and it's not been an easy process for them, and it's not been an inexpensive process because of the amount of surveying and work that's been done. I have a large map over here, under the overhang here, to the north side of the Chamber that shows you the surveyed boundary description that has been agreed upon between the two counties and that is described in the bill. I feel that this is something that we very much need to do, it will assist both counties in clearing up a discrepancy and a problem for them and most of all it will help those citizens that are residing in those areas that have difficulty figuring out, when a crime is committed, where they go for help, what law enforcement agency they call, not to mention the problem with roads and who pays for certain road improvements and that kind of thing. Those issues will be resolved effective, if my amendment is adopted, this coming January 1st. Thank you, Mr. Lieutenant Governor. I'll be glad to answer any questions, if there are any.
