CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the adoption of the amendment.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: The amendment is agreed to. Debate on the advancement of LB 349? Senator Preister.

SENATOR PREISTER: Thank you, Honorable President. I rise to see...we had talked just a little earlier about the Government, Military and Veterans Affairs Committee bill that would create municipal counties. And on this bill we're looking at changing a boundary line, as I understand it, between Butler and Platte Counties. I'm wondering if we could just combine the two and create one county, Platte-Butler, or Butler-Platte? We could save some money perhaps, we could eliminate the dispute over the boundary and when I go back to Platte County, to visit my relatives, I could get shot for suggesting it, but I just couldn't pass up the opportunity, as we have these two bills that seem to be overlapping, to suggest, Senator Bromm, what you might think of the idea, if I would propose an amendment?

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Senator Bromm.

SENATOR BROMM: Appreciate the discussion. As it occurs to me, the big question would be whether we'd call it "But" or "Platler"? (Laughter) But I...I...I don't think that would be a very easy job to get done, so I'd just as soon like to just change the boundary line for right now. So...

SENATOR PREISTER: I respect your opinion and I won't offer that amendment.
