PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Thank you, Senator Robak. Discussion on the advancement of LB 349? Senator Bromm, you're recognized to close.

SENATOR BROMM: Just very briefly. Most of all, this is for the people of those two counties and especially the people that live in this kind of no-mans land area. So I would appreciate your support in advancing the bill. Thank you.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Thank you, Senator Bromm. The question is the advancement of LB 349 to E & R Initial. Those in favor vote aye; those opposed vote nay. Mr. Clerk, please record.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the advancement of LB 349.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: The bill is advanced. Mr. Clerk, next bill.

CLERK: Mr. President, LB 1304, introduced by Senator Janssen. (Read title.) The bill was introduced on January 9 of this year, referred to the Government Committee. The bill was advanced to General File. I do have committee amendments, Mr. President. (AM2388, Legislative Journal page 677.)

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Thank you, Mr. Clerk. Senator Janssen, you're recognized to open on LB 1304.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Thank you, Mr. Lieutenant Governor, members of the Legislature. LB 1304 was heard by the Government Committee and advanced to General File. It is a Speaker priority bill because of the time sensitivity of the bill. The bill clarifies the language of the handling of audits for fire protection districts with expenditures of less than \$150,000 a year. Back
